SAINT JOHN BOSCO - FATHER AND FRIEND OF YOUTH

Saint John Bosco, fondly known as Don Bosco, was an Italian Catholic priest who dedicated his life for the education of young boys.

Don Bosco was born at Becchi, near Turin, in Northern Italy on 16th August 1815. His father died when he was two and so his poor family needed his services at the farm. Bosco's elder stepbrother Antony opposed all his plans of getting even an elementary education. Yet through sheer dint of will power and with the help of many generous hearts, he got himself educated. At the same time, he did many odd jobs, all of which he later taught to his boys.

He became a priest in 1841 and expanded his work for poor and abandoned boys born and bred in poverty. To cater to the needs of such boys, he started an Oratory or Boys Club and helped them to spend their time usefully. In order to prepare boys for skilled labour, in 1853, Don Bosco turned his mother Margaret's kitchen into a make-shift cobbler and carpenter shop. This was the first catholic trade school in Italy.

With the dedicated group of followers who gathered around him he was able to help the street urchins to become honest citizens and God-fearing men. To win the hearts of the youngsters he used the Preventive System. Don Bosco explained it as a happy blend of reason, religion and loving kindness. In fact, when asked about the secret of his immense success with youngsters, he simply answered "Love."

To continue the work that he had started, he founded a religious society of priests and brothers, known as Salesians (SDB) in 1859. They are group of persons set apart within the Catholic Church for the education of youth, especially the poor and the abandoned. To spread his work to the needy girls, with the help of Saint Mary Mazzarello, he founded a society of nuns called The Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (FMA), known as Salesian Sisters in 1982. Besides these two in 1876 he founded a third spiritual family called the union of



Salesian Co-operators, a group of men and women, married or unmarried who, without becoming priests or nuns would work for youth in the spirit of Don Bosco. His charisma is being carried out in various parts of the world with the help of his followers called 'Salesians' and the Salesians are present in 138 countries serving the youth.

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

The Salesians are in the field of education for several years, with the rich experience in molding and forming the young generation. They have established a school in Coimbatore adopting the CBSE curriculum in 2014. The school is affiliated to CBSE, New Delhi, up to Senior Secondary.

The school provides quality education of international standards with modern technology and state-of-the art facilities. The aim of the school is to lay emphasis on experiential learning and grooming of young children thereby making them responsible citizens and leaders with a difference.

The school is accommodated on a large space of land. It has a serene ambience. Moreover, it has a state of art playground, play area for children, parking facilities and an area for futuristic expansion. Miyawaki forest to nurture the nature.

All classrooms are well ventilated, spacious with good air circulation. The classrooms have wall-mounted boards and interactive boards for smart class and interactive sessions.

Display boards are placed in all class rooms for student-teacher exhibits and demonstrations. Storage units are well placed to pile books and materials. These units provide relaxation to students so as to store their extra material and notebooks and carry them only when required.

Education is a continuous process – a blend of factors and influences that form character and personality. Two institutions however, play a prominent role and have formal educational responsibilities before the law and society – the family and the school. Each of these institutions cannot operate on their own. Communication and co-operation between them is therefore essential.

Parents have always been and always will be the first educators of a child. They have the right and the duty to lay the intellectual and emotional bases for their children's lives and to help develop their system of values and attitudes. Children learn best from those they love. Parents, you are your child's first and most influential teacher!

An Educational system/school must aim towards training young people to be good citizens and sound professionals, providing them with the basics for a lifelong learning and personal development.

- Education of the Head
- Education of the Heart
- Education of the Hands

The Role of Parents in Home Learning:

- Schedule a daily homework time. Encourage your child's efforts and be available for questions. Spend time discussing.
- Read together. Taking the time to read is the most successful way to encourage kids to read and is critical to a child's education.
- Use TV and social media wisely. Establish a TV viewing hours and help your child choose programmes for viewing. Select programmes to watch together and discuss. Beware of the social groups that your wards engaged with.
- Offer praise and encouragement. Encourage your child to put in time and effort to complete assignments, to work hard. Encourage them to persevere. Cultivate a warm and supporting atmosphere while also setting and enforcing standards for schoolwork.
- Talk to the children. Know their friends and whereabouts. Support them in their school and extra-curricular activities. Keep them involved in family activities. Stress their importance as role models to younger siblings.
- Communicate values openly with your children. By talking about and living values like honesty, self – reliance and responsibility parents are helping their children make good decisions.
- Cultivate healthy eating habits, junk food like chips, pastries and aerated drinks should not be a regular feature in snack boxes. Diet plays a major role in the all-round development of a child.
- Ensure healthy sleeping habits. Encourage your child to sleep at a set time – EVERYDAY. Children need a minimum of 8 hours of sleep. Quite a number of children cannot enjoy their learning in school, as they are too sleepy.



School-Related Parental Duties

- Reinforce values and discipline instilled in school. Let the children be responsible for completing class work.
- Respect teachers for the nobility of their profession and give timely response to their feedback and observations.

Avoid criticizing your child's teachers in the presence of the children. The teachers are their role models in school.

Seek the advice of the teachers if you think your child needs special help.

Behavioural, Academic and Emotional problems in children may be directed to the School Counselor.

Trust the school authorities enough to know that they have the best interests of your children. Offer active and enthusiastic support for all school activities.

Kindly discourage your child from taking leave as far as possible.

You are expected to go through your child's details in school app periodically to check whether there is a message for you. Keep in touch with the day progress of your child and discuss it with the authorities regularly at the appointed hours.

Criticism of a student's teacher or the school in the presence of the child should be avoided because it may cause the student to lose respect for the teacher and the school.

The school teachers will not take tuitions for their own class students. So, do not force them to teach your wards privately.

- Kindly inform the school if there is any change in address.
- Parents should be decently dressed while entering the school campus.
- Only English should be spoken in the school premises in order to obtain a command over spoken English. Parents are requested to encourage this practice at home also.
- After every periodical assessment, the parents of students who have not performed well will have to meet Principal to take the progress reports in person at the appointed time which will be intimated.



- Entrusting a pupil to the school implies that the parents agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the school. Parents should see that their children prepare home lessons properly and devote at least 2-3 hours in the evening to their studies.
- As educating a child is primarily the responsibility of the parents, they are expected to co-operate with the school with regard to pupil's integral growth. Parents are requested to follow up the child in the process of growth and maintain a cordial, co-operative relationship with the school authorities.

SCHOOL WEBSITE & SCHOOL APP

All the school circulars are published in the school website 'www.donboscocbe.edu.in'. Parents are encouraged to go through the website and keep themselves updated with the latest happenings in the school. The circulars are normally published every now and then. There are many other features on the website.

Parents are requested to log in to the school app with the username and password provided to them. Teachers will be entering the student's remarks (positive and negative). This will help track each student's progress, behaviour and overall performance effectively. You are requested to go through all these features in the school app. Kindly update your child's profile in case of change in address, email address or mobile number. To function better, the parents are requested to update the school app at least once in two months.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE PARENTS

Our school has implemented digital communication with the parents adopting Smart School App.

Daily home works and other official communications will be done through Smart School App.

All the parents are expected to install Smart School App in your smart mobile or PC and have smart communications with the school.



GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Don Bosco School of Excellence follows CBSE curriculum which is run by the Salesians of Don Bosco.
2. It is a Catholic Institute established and administered under Minority Rights. It caters to the Catholic community, but to the extent possible, its doors are also open to other communities irrespective of caste or creed.
3. We follow the Don Bosco Educational method of Reason, Faith and loving Kindness. This is based on the conviction that the heart of education is the education of the heart.
4. At Don Bosco School Of Excellence, the process of education involves bringing together young people, their parents / guardians, the Management and Staff, to form an INTEGRATED COMMUNITY.
5. The school conducts certain drives for funds for charitable /educational causes during the year. Kindly note that no student or parent is ever compelled to donate towards these funds. Any contribution should be made out of sheer goodwill and bearing in mind the purpose of the collection which is always clearly announced beforehand and duly carried out.
6. Medical inspection of the pupil is held regularly by competent team of doctors, who issue a report of each student, and this is sent to the parents for follow up.
7. An in-house Counsellor interviews each student and compiles a Report and Recommendations for further medical or psychological intervention, which is passed on to the parents for further action.

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

1. Admissions are done by the principal and the management in accordance with the admission policy of the institution.
2. If the candidate seeking admission has previously attended any school, a conduct certificate and transfer certificate from the previous school must be produced. In case of candidates coming from outside the state of TamilNadu or any board other than CBSE, the transfer certificate is mandatory.



3. Admission may be refused to a candidate who is underage/overage for the class for which admission is sought.
4. Application for Transfer Certificate shall be made in writing to the principal by the parent or the legal guardian of the pupil.
5. Admissions are open to Pre KG to IX and XI only.
6. If an application for T.C. or any other certificate is made after a lapse of more than one year from the date on which the pupil left the school, a fee of Rs.100/- will be charged for each lapsed year.
7. Conduct certificate will not be issued to any pupil who applies for it a year or more after he has left the school.

SCHOOL RULES

Uniform and Dress Code:

1. All students should wear the sports uniform on the day allotted to them (Wednesday).
2. The school uniform should be neat and tidy.
3. Shoes must be regularly cleaned and polished.
4. Students must purchase the uniform from the school office and have it stitched per the school pattern.
5. The Uniform should be of proper fit.

Cleanliness and Hygiene:

6. Personal hygiene and neatness are essential. Hair must be well groomed.
7. Boys must keep their hair short and well groomed.
8. Girls with hair extending below shoulder level but not beyond mid - back can keep it neatly tied in a ponytail. Hair longer than mid-back must be neatly plaited.
9. Chewing gum is forbidden in school Campus.
10. Students must keep their Classrooms and the campus neat and free of litter.
11. Dyeing of hair, wearing long earrings, growing beard/moustache, styled or shaped sideburns are not allowed.



12. Keep your nails clean and closely clipped.
13. Any student who deliberately violates the rule will be punished.

Costly items:

14. Parents are advised not to allow their children to wear or bring any valuables to school.
15. Mobile phones, smart watch, CD's, books and magazines of objectionable nature should not be brought to school.
16. Students are encouraged to develop a spirit of generosity. However, no gifts of any sort, individual or collective, should be given to the teachers.

Discipline and Punctuality:

17. Movement to the classroom after Assembly and to and from Physical Education (P.E.T.) classes, Library and Laboratories should be in silence and in an orderly manner.
18. The students need to come to the school on time before 9 am. Late comers need to meet the principal and they will be marked as late comers. 4 late coming in a month will be considered one day of absent.
19. The school main gate and the entrance gate will be closed at 9 am.
20. Quiet and orderly behaviour should be maintained in the rest rooms.

Lingua Franca:

21. English is the common language of communication within the school premises.

Annual Day, Sports day and Tour:

22. The students will be taken for a picnic or for a tour in a year. The students need to contribute for their expenses and need to get consent letter from Parents.
23. Sports Days & Annual Days are important school events in which all the students are expected to participate.
24. For Annual Day and Sports Day, students will be required to contribute towards the cost of costumes and other related expenses as these are not covered under the regular school fees.



25. All students are expected to take part in co-curricular activities, sports and club activities of the school as part of their education.
26. School games, exercise and drills are compulsory for all except in case of exemption by medical authority.

Birthday Celebration:

27. The students can come in colour dress on their birthdays.
28. Cutting cakes are not allowed inside the classroom. They can distribute chocolates during break and lunch hours.
29. The students are encouraged to celebrate their birthdays by contributing a book to the library, planting a sapling or gifting a flower pot.

PROMOTION RULES

Promotions are based on the students overall performance throughout the academic year. A combination of grades and report evaluations is used to assess the child's progress. Communication skills in English are assessed through continuous evaluation. Regular 'Open Day' meetings are held to inform parents about their child's academic and social development. Parents are encouraged to attend these meetings prepared with relevant questions concerning their child/ward.

The transition from Pre-Primary to Primary, Class IX to X, and Class XI to XII follows a defined procedure. Admission to these classes requires the submission of an application form, which will be reviewed and accepted based on the pupil's performance.

FEE RULES

- Every pupil, including the newly admitted will have to pay the fees of the academic year as per Principal's instructions. If a pupil leaves the school during the term, he/she shall have no right to claim a remission of any of the portion of the fees.
- Fees are to be paid before the school re-opens. Students will not be permitted to attend the class on the reopening day if fees are not paid.



- The amount payable as fees is subjected to revision even with retrospective effect, within a school year as circumstances warrant.
- As a minority institution, no fee exception is permitted here. Application and Admission fee of Rs.500/- shall be paid at the time of fresh admission to the school.
- Fees are to be paid online through school website with any Bank Credit Card, Internet Banking and School App. Online payment will be accepted through South Indian Bank. It is made available in the school website. The parents need to enter with their ward's admission number/ name and follow the procedure to pay the fees.
- Please note that the school shall not accept cash payments. As per CBSE guidelines fees should be collected via online transaction. (Digital mode).

ATTENDANCE

1. Regular attendance is a key requisite for a good student and DBX attaches much importance to it. A special certificate is awarded to students with hundred percent attendance.
2. Students must report to class on time every day. Latecomers will be allowed to enter the class only if the reason for delay is entered in the school app and verified by the teacher. Students who are late more than three times in a month will be asked to go home. If a student is regularly late then his/ her parents need to meet the Principal.
3. If a pupil remains absent for one day or more due to illness or any other plausible reason, he/she must fill up the absence record duly signed by his/her parent. If a pupil is ill for two days, the fact must be communicated to the school. Absence for 5 days on medical grounds must be accompanied by a medical certificate and should



be sanctioned by the principal. If a pupil is ill for more than 7 days, the parent must accompany the child with a doctor's certificate and a letter explaining the absence. For any other absence of more than 7 days, a written sanction of the Principal is required. In every case, the absence must be recorded in the school app. If a student is absent for more than 10 days and the reason for absence is not communicated in writing, then the student's name is liable to be struck off from the rolls/ register.

4. No student shall be absent from school without prior written permission from the Principal (except in cases of illness). In case of an emergency, if prior leave was not possible, the student must return accompanied by a parent. During school hours, students are allowed to leave the classroom or school premises without the permission of the teacher. Written permission of the Principal is required for the student to leave the premises during the school hours. Any breach of these rules will be viewed seriously.
5. All students are expected to return to school on the first day after vacations or holidays.
6. Leave, absence, and late attendance record of the students will always be kept updated in the school app.

CONDUCT OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

1. Every student of Don Bosco School Of Excellence is expected to uphold the high standards of the institution by displaying good manners and exemplary behaviour towards both staff and fellow students.
2. Defacing school property by scribbling on walls, furniture, or floors is strictly prohibited. Any damage caused to school property, including sports and games equipment, must be compensated for. The amount to be paid will be determined by the Principal or Administrator and is considered final.
3. Dangerous games or harmful amusements are strictly forbidden. Students are expected to share the school's limited space in a spirit of cooperation and kindness, avoiding any action that may hurt or disturb others.



4. After the classes or any function, the students must leave the school building and the premises in an orderly and disciplined manner.
5. Students are not permitted to use the school address to receive personal letters or correspondence without special permission.
6. During school hours pupils may leave the premises ONLY with the permission of the Principal and after informing the class teacher.
7. All students are accountable to the school authorities for their behaviour not only within the school but also outside the campus, particularly on their way to and from school, where they are expected to conduct themselves with decorum.
8. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness or neglect of duty, long absence without permission leave note, disrespect toward the members of the staff, indocility to correction, malpractices during test, stealing, bad moral influence or any other grave fault deemed as such by the school authorities justifies severe sanctions from the school.
9. All students are expected to go home immediately after class, and not stay back in school unless permitted for a specific activity or practices. Parents are expected to take responsibility for their children after school hours and make necessary arrangements to take their children home on time.
10. No books, periodicals, newspapers or pictures other than prescribed ones, may be brought into the school premises without the permission of the principal. Likewise articles liable to prove source of disturbance such as crackers, water pistol, and colour powder are not to be brought into the school premises.
11. Any form of bullying, ragging or causing injury to others will result in a disciplinary committee review and could result in expulsion with a negative conduct certificate.
12. Students suffering from contagious diseases are not permitted to attend school.



EXAMINATIONS

- There are four assessments –Pre Midterm, Midterm, Post Midterm and Final Assessment during the course of the year.
- Progress reports are issued to parents after each assessment and as required. For promotion at the end of the academic year, the overall performance throughout the year will be considered. Students who are absent for the Pre Midterm, Midterm, Post Midterm or Final Assessments without prior permission from the Principal will not be awarded any marks for the missed assessments. Furthermore, assessments must be taken on the scheduled dates, and no retests will be conducted for absentees.
- Absolute silence is expected in the examination hall. Students found using unfair means or assisting others in doing so will face strict disciplinary action at the discretion of the Principal. This may include detention or dismissal from the school regardless of the student's academic record.
- No books, papers or unauthorized materials are allowed inside the examination hall. Each student should have the required writing or drawing materials. Lending or borrowing is not permitted in the exam hall.

SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENT

Pre Mid-Term, Mid-Term and Post-Mid Term assessments will be conducted at regular intervals. Pre Mid-Term will be conducted for 40 marks. Mid Term, Post-Mid Term and Final Assessments will be conducted for 80 marks. School will award grades as per the following grading scale.

CONDUCT IN THE CLASSROOM

- When the teachers or the members of the management enter the class or leave, the students are expected to stand up in due respect and greet them respectfully. Silence is very conducive to quiet reflection and study both for one self and others. Hence if anyone wants to ask questions, doubts or discuss matters of study with the teachers or his/her classmates, permission of the supervising teacher is necessary.
- Loud talking or clapping of hands or any disturbance to other classes is never permitted. For choral recitation or singing or anything else that is liable to cause disturbance to the other classes, students will be taken outdoors.
- In the absence of the teacher the class leader immediately takes charge of the class and reports the fact to the principal or to the coordinator, with the help of the assistant leader. Students are expected to study their lessons in strict silence and seriousness in the absence of the teacher.
- No one may take up any collection or impose a fine without the authorization of the principal. No presentation of gifts either by students or parents to teachers, or any demonstration of any sort towards the teachers may be done, without the explicit permission of the principal.
